## Varia

**Larry Barnett**, Director of Public Safety, gave a presentation entitled, "How long is the arm of the law? Promoting good citizenship among off-campus students," at the U.S. Department of Education's 16th annual national meeting on alcohol, other drug abuse and violence prevention in higher education in Seattle, Washington, November 21-24. This year's theme was *Reaching New Heights: Building Partnerships for Comprehensive Prevention*. Mr. Barnett discussed the advantages of engaging local law enforcement and property owners in community policing initiatives which have led to declines in alcohol-related problems and reductions in incidences of violence in neighborhoods where students reside or may frequent.

**Stephen Davis**, Knapp Chair, Psychology Department, was co-author of two articles: "Factors Influencing Self-Rated Preparedness for Graduate School: A Survey of Graduate Students" and "Student Use of Introductory Texts: Comparative Survey Findings from Two Universities" in the autumn issue of *Teaching of Psychology*.

Dr. Davis also delivered the keynote address, "The Scholarship of Teaching: Rats, Type A Individuals, Death Anxiety, and Discrimination in the Shopping Center" at the Southwest Conference on Teaching of Psychology in Houston, Texas, on November 15.

**Anne Hendershott**, Sociology Department, recently published *The Politics of Deviance* (Encounter Books). The book explores the role of advocacy groups in the redefinition or construction of contemporary social problems. Reviews of her book have appeared in several major newspapers and in publications including *America*, *National Review*, *Washington Monthly*, and other academic journals. She has presented readings throughout the country and has recently completed a taped reading for CPANN's Book TV.

**Ken Keith**, Psychology Department, is author of "Peak-Shift Phenomenon: A Teaching Activity for Basic Learning Theory," appearing in the autumn issue of the journal *Teaching of Psychology*. He is also co-author of "Conceptualization, Measurement, and Application of Quality of Life for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities: Report of an International Panel of Experts," appearing in the December issue of *Mental Retardation*.

Dr. Keith also participated in the fall meetings of the College Board Advanced Placement Psychology Test Development Committee at Princeton, New Jersey.

**Marcie D. Rinka**, Foreign Languages and Literatures Department, presented a paper entitled "Imagining a New World: A rainha do ignoto by Emilia Freitas" at the South Central Modern Language Association Meeting in Austin, Texas, on November 2.
