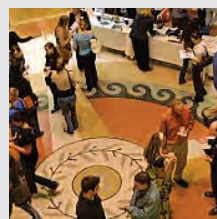
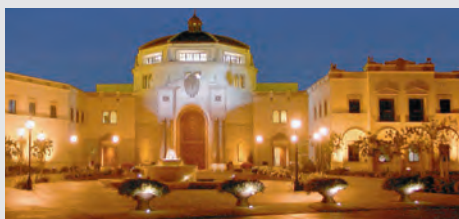
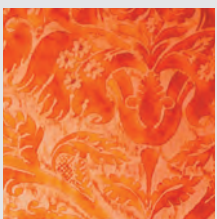

Lisa Sowle Cahill, the J. Donald Monan Professor in the Department of Theology, Boston College, is a leading figure in contemporary Roman Catholic moral theology and a central figure in the broader field of Christian Ethics. Her research interests include the history of Christian ethics, the New Testament and ethics, Catholic social ethics, feminist theology, sex and gender ethics, bioethics, and the ethics of war and peace. Cahill has advised U.S. bishops on issues such as the role of the laity, HIV-AIDS, and the implementation of the Vatican's Apostolic Constitution on Catholic Universities, and has presented at the Vatican about women's health care.
