When is a Tuesday a Thursday and a Wednesday a Friday? Next semester!

On Tuesday, May 14, classes will meet as if it were Thursday. On Wednesday, May 15, classes will meet as if it were Friday.

Academic Calendar FAQS:

What does "A Tuesday is a Thursday and a Wednesday is a Friday" actually mean?

This change means that on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 14</u> classes will meet as if it were <u>Thursday</u>. On <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>May 15</u> classes will meet as if it were <u>Friday</u>.

What does "Thursday-Friday" class Schedule on "Tuesday-Wednesday" mean?

This change means that on Tuesday, classes normally scheduled for Thursday will meet; and on Wednesday, classes normally scheduled for Friday will meet.

Why is this happening?

This change equalizes the number of class meetings held on each day of the week in each term, so that there are the same number of instructional days for each day of the week in the Spring 2019 semester.

What about me? I have a Tuesday only, Wednesday only and/or a Monday/Wednesday class. Does my schedule change on those two days?

Yes! When you wake up on the morning of Tuesday, May 14, pretend that it is a Thursday. When you wake up on the morning of Wednesday, May 15 pretend that it is a Friday. Go to the classes you would normally attend on those days. If you have no classes scheduled on "Thursday" or "Friday," then you don't go to class!
