#### ELIGIBILITY

- All current USD freshmen-juniors are welcome to apply
- Students must be enrolled through the 2012-2013 academic year
- Commitment to attend mandatory meetings pre/during/post conference
- Applicants must be available for the entire week of May 29th - June 2nd
- Applicants must not have attended NCORE with USD in the past

#### EXPECTATIONS

- Participants must attend two pre-conference meetings; fully participate in conference activities including pre-conference institutes, three (3) workshops per day, all keynotes, networking opportunities and scheduled group activities; and two (2) post-conference meetings in fall semester 2012.
- Participants are required to keep a daily reflection journal during the conference.
- Participants will collaborate with UFMC staff to provide an educational program relating to diversity and inclusion at USD during the 2012-2013 academic year.
