1997 USD LAW GRAD JOINS REFERENCE TEAM

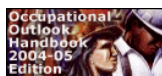

The LRCPlus document delivery service provides law faculty with photocopies of journal articles and court opinions in the LRC collection upon request. Please allow 48 hours for completion. An electronic request form is available at <http://www.sandiego.edu/lrc/faculty/lrcplus.php> (from the LRC web page, click on Faculty Resources and then LRCPlus).

In addition, law faculty can have books and other materials delivered to their offices and many LRC periodicals can be routed to them on a regular basis. To arrange for these services, contact the Reference Desk by e-mail at lrcref@sandiego.edu or by phone at x4612.

To assist law faculty in browsing current law review and law journal articles, the LRC can create an electronic personalized version of the Current Index to Legal Periodicals called *SmartCILP* for each professor or instructor, custom tailored to individual study and research needs. Faculty members obtain this service by contacting John Adkins to fill out profiles of their subject and journal contents interests. Once the profile is submitted, the professor receives an e-mail each Wednesday with citations to the latest publications.
