Assessment Overview

The Master of Science in Supply Chain Management (MSSCM) program assesses six learning outcomes on a rotating basis. The programs use rubrics in appropriate program courses to evaluate the quality of student work in the areas of advanced supply chain management knowledge, interpersonal skills in diverse environments, critical analysis skills, applied supply chain management skills, business communication skills, and standards of ethical behavior.

Results & Actions

The MSSCM program Fall 2015 assessment activities included the development of rubric assignments by course. Faculty on the program oversight committee identified courses at the beginning of the program and at the end of the program where learning outcomes could be benchmarked and re-evaluated for each student. The idea is to have these rubrics embedded in the assigned Blackboard course. The learning outcome rubrics are meant to replace the faculty members' grading rubric for an identified assignment (by faculty choice). This new method of collection began with Cohort 28 which started the program in Fall 2015.

In addition to direct measures, an MSSCM Learning Outcome Self-Assessment was completed by every graduating student in December of 2015.
