Expedition Highlights

- ✓ Explore the world's last great wilderness in the company of a team of top naturalists celebrating Lindblad's 55-plus years of expedition heritage.
- ✓ Hike on magnificent mountains and see huge glaciers, plus observe thousands of penguins: gentoos, Adélies and chinstraps.

Itinerary

DAY 1 ● SANTIAGO, CHILE

Arrive in Santiago and explore the city at your leisure.

DAY 2 ● FLY TO USHUAIA, ARGENTINA/EMBARK

Fly on the recommended flight to Ushuaia, the southern-most city in the world, for a provided transfer to the airport, with luggage assistance.* Enjoy lunch onboard a private catamaran cruise on the Beagle Channel before embarking the ship.

DAYS 3-4 ● AT SEA/DRAKE PASSAGE

You awake this morning well into your journey across the Drake Passage. Lying between Cape Horn and the Antarctic Peninsula, the Drake holds a unique place in maritime lore. Sometimes misty and gray, other times calm and clear, crossing the legendary Drake Passage is unforgettable—a milestone in any adventurer's personal travel history. (B,L,D)

DAYS 5-9 ● EXPLORING ANTARCTICA

With long hours of daylight at this time of year, you have ample opportunity to explore the Antarctic Peninsula and the surrounding islands. In keeping with the nature of an expedition, the schedule is flexible to take advantage of the unexpected—watching whales perform off the bow, taking an after-dinner Zodiac cruise or heading out on an unplanned landing. Conditions permitting, walk ashore and kayak among the ice floes and experience close encounters with wildlife. You may have the thrill of watching the powerful ship head into the pack ice or stepping ashore to thousands of Adélie and chinstrap penguins. You'll learn how climate change affects the penguin populations and how to best capture images of those same penguins from an accomplished professional photographer. Back aboard, the undersea specialist may present video from that day's dive or show rare images taken up to 1,000 feet below the surface using the ROV. The expert staff will craft an expedition where you will learn, see and experience more. (B,L,D)

DAYS 10-11 ● AT SEA

Enjoy the ship's amenities as the Antarctic coast disappears from view, round the southernmost tip of South America and see the meeting of the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. Celebrate your voyage at a farewell dinner on board. (B,L,D)

DAY 12 ● USHUAIA/DISEMBARK/SANTIAGO

Disembark in Ushuaia, and fly on the recommended flights to Santiago for your flights home; we'll provide transfers to the airport and luggage assistance.*
