



## Federal TEACH Grant Program

SOLES participates in the Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program. TEACH Grants were established under the *College Cost Reduction and Access Act* (CCRAA) to benefit current and prospective teachers. Students are eligible to receive up to **\$4,000 per academic year for graduate and undergraduate level coursework.**

The TEACH Grant is a conditional grant program. If the service obligation is not met, this grant will revert to an Unsubsidized Stafford Loan with interest accrued from initial disbursement.

### Eligibility Criteria Check List:

	File the FAFSA
	U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen
	Enrolled as an undergraduate, post-baccalaureate or graduate student at the University of San Diego
	Enrolled in a teaching program or major
	Have a 3.25 cumulative GPA

	Meet with Assistant Dean of the School of Leadership and Education Sciences

Award Levels:	
Full time per academic year	\$4,000
$\frac{3}{4}$ time	\$3,000
$\frac{1}{2}$ time	\$2,000
<half time	\$1,000
Total for undergraduates	\$16,000
Total for graduate study	\$8,000

### Other Considerations:

After receiving degree and/or credential, must teach in a high-need field. Current high-need fields (in schools that serve low-income students) are:

- Bilingual Education and English Language Acquisition
- Foreign Language
- Mathematics
- Reading Specialist
- Science
- Special Education
- Other Identified Teacher Shortage Areas (not geographic areas) as of the time recipients receive the grant or as of the time they begin teaching in that field.
