 - Thanks to ASG
 - Current highlights: mental health/behavioral health
 - Taste of home region gathering was very successful, geared toward new students, included foods from different regions of the country, conversation cards to facilitate belonging and connectedness
 - Mental health checkins: professional barbers come to campus, and in exchange for getting a free haircut, meet with counselors for 10 minutes. Mental health check-in targeted male international students
 - Resilient Together: around Veterans day
 - "I think my friend has an eating disorder" connected friends of those struggling with resources on how to assist them
 - Home Away From Home Mental Health Checkin
 - SPF and Sips: partner with SunBum, other sunscreens purchased, and wheel of education for skin cancer prevention is upcoming!
 - Nourish to Flourish, the week before finals: therapy dogs, other programs in accordance with peer feedback
 - NarCan training and distribution program: NarCan training will be April 14th,

there's also an asynchronous training available online - 189 students have been distributed NarCan this academic year, encouraging others

-QPR- question persuade refer: student trainings are low enrollment, and they get cancelled if less than five people are enrolled -m USD is a JED Campus (suicide prevention), number of QPR certified staff is growing and important - aid in serious mental health issues for those who do not seek professional help can be live daving

-Fostering Healthy Masculinity: this April, events focusing on male population with fun outings, but also important conversations and dialogue around healthy masculinity

-Violence Prevention Team: Violence Prevention Certificate (becoming a semester-long 0.5 course for both graduates and undergraduates) has partnered with the LGBT+ commons. In the fall was the Domestic Violence Awareness Month; April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month with many events, including drop in events, trauma-informed YOGA, Denim Day, etc - many upcoming events

-Questions about the Wellness Wing in the Wellness Center: two telehealth booths - everyone has access to Timely Care and the Counseling Center, but virtual TimelyCare appointments are available

-Nap pods in the Wellness Center can be reserved, Prayer Spaces in the Wellness Center available for drop in from all denominations

-Specialized-counseling is available in SCWP (specific topics- mandated referrals, disordered eating, mental health checkins for athletes, Narcan)

-Peer-educator workspace available too - paid positions, health promotion interns (5), RSVP peer educators (7-8), student admin support team members (front desk), wellness ambassadors (volunteer position - 12 currently)

-Follow on Instagram for interest in job positions, opening soon in April

Senator Jose: Are the jobs federal work study?

-Front desk is FWS; the others are casual workers

Where are the prayer rooms? More information?

-We highly encourage you to visit SCWP. It's not exclusive, but primarily for counseling. After 5, the space is available for students. If people are seeking the prayer room, it's kind of behind a barrier, but folks can sign in and just proceed. All are welcome.

Senator Jameson: Is the prayer room associated with UM? And does it have prayer materials?

It's not a programmed space, but yes, it has nice chairs, prayer mats, beads, candles, supplies etc. We worked with UM and are partnering with them. If students have requests for more materials they may ask.

Yes, the counseling team offers a series of wellness groups. There are probably ten different ones running in the space for folks to drop in. They are not super well attended and time goes into them. They have been dialed down from "group therapy" to "workshops" in order to entice more attendance.

President Lily: thank you for coming. From the perspective of ASG, we have our Health and Wellness Coordinator, but beyond that, how can we support you going forward?

-Funding is of course appreciated- we have a small budget. We have a request for next year from the head of the wellness center; funding for flu shots has decreased, and are hoping for full funding to the health center in the next year. In addition to money, support for the programs is so needed. Go to a class! Come to our events!

Senator Michael: Are you providing self defense classes?

We have not, but that would be considered.

Speaker Bri: there are self defense classes available through PSafe.
