Does the submission clearly demonstrate an understanding of all <u>key stakeholders</u> affected by the problem (directly and indirectly)? 3. Does the submission outline a hypothesis as to <u>why and when</u> the problem <u>started occurring</u> and why it <u>persists</u>? 		
2	<p>Criteria 2: Understanding of the solutions landscape</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Does the submission clearly articulate the overall solutions landscape in a <u>concise and descriptive</u> way, including acknowledgment of the possible <u>diverse range</u> of existing players, resources and networks? 2. Does the submission demonstrate a deeper understanding of the <u>nature and diversity</u> of the existing solutions, including an understanding of what has <u>worked</u>, what hasn't and the <u>change needed</u>? 3. Does the submission explore some of the <u>models for change</u> being tried and what distinguishes the approaches?

Does the submission clearly identify any potential gaps, market opportunities or what is missing from the solutions landscape? 2. Does the submission identify possible collaborations to provide a more holistic solution? E.g. knowledge sharing opportunities, regulation, etc.?

Does the submission suggest what the proposed solution/recommendation in round 2 would be, drawing from the levers from change and/or gaps? 2. Does the submission identify what the first next steps will be? 		
<p>5</p>	<p>Criteria 5: Research Approach & Presentation of Deliverables</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Does the submission demonstrate a diverse <u>range</u> of <u>research sources</u>? 2. Has the submission been <u>adequately cited/referenced</u> in the bibliography?
