



MORAL CHARACTER DISCLOSURE

As a student at the University of San Diego School of Law, you have the ongoing duty to disclose any new moral character information in a timely manner. Timely disclosure is considered to be within 30 days of the event(s). Please note that character questions should be construed broadly. If you are in doubt or have any questions, contact the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. The following questions can guide you on whether you are required to disclose a matter to the school.

1. Have you ever been found to have violated a university or college honor code, or been subject to any academic or disciplinary action (e.g., allegation, expulsion, suspension, probation, warning, dismissal, invitation or requirement to withdraw) from any academic institution attended, any employer, profession, or professional association?
2. Have you ever attended any law school including USD School of Law? If "Yes," state where and when and give clear reasons for leaving in an electronic attachment. You must provide a letter from the dean or other authorized official verifying your good standing, together with an official transcript from any law school previously attended.
3. Have you ever been charged with a misdemeanor or felony (or the equivalent in a juvenile court), or is any such charge now pending? In responding to this question, please include incidents where the charge was originally a misdemeanor or felony, but may have ultimately been reduced to a lesser charge or dismissed. Include all incidents, no matter how minor, even if the record has been sealed, obliterated, destroyed, dismissed or expunged.
4. Have you ever been convicted of the violation of a misdemeanor or felony? As used herein, a conviction includes a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, or a verdict or finding of guilt, regardless of whether sentence is imposed by the court.
5. Have you ever been convicted by General Court Martial or did you receive a dishonorable discharge from the military? Has a restraining order ever been filed against you?
6. Has a restraining order ever been filed against you?

If the answer to any of the above questions is YES, please attach complete narrative disclosure addressed to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs, along with this form. The disclosure must include the following:

- Date of the incident being disclosed
- Location of the incident
- Detailed summary of circumstances involving the incident, including any specific charges or code violations.
- Disposition of the incident
- Attach any supporting documentation

By signing this form, I acknowledge that USD School of Law reserves the right to modify or revoke an offer of acceptance or scholarship and for my student status to be reviewed based on any false, misleading, or incomplete statements or any additional or changed information provided. I understand that any false, misleading, or incomplete statements discovered after my matriculation may cause allegations to be filed under the Student Code of Rights and Responsibilities and may result in sanctions, including suspension or expulsion. I grant permission for USD School of Law to request and obtain copies of any official disciplinary records from any undergraduate or graduate institution attended before admission to the JD program. I understand that this form and any associated disclosure(s) will become part of my permanent student record and will be disclosed as appropriate to relevant bar authorities.
