* A score that does not meet the minimum passing score in the testing jurisdiction may be portable to another jurisdiction if the score is at or above the level required in the receiving jurisdiction. Illinois and Maryland will adopt the UBE effective July 2019. Ohio will adopt the UBE effect July 2020. Texas will adopt the UBE effective February 2021. Texas has yet to announce its minimum passing score or whether it will require a jurisdiction-specific law component.

The Uniform Bar Exam will consist of:

- Six, 30-minute essays;
- Two, 90-minute performance tests; and
- 200 multiple choice questions in six hours: Multistate Bar Examination (MBE).
