Program is assessed by multiple methods that demonstrate clinical competence in delivering primary health care and achieving program objectives. These formative and summative assessment methods include group activities, exams, quizzes, discussion boards, reflections, case studies, class presentations, scholarly papers, both formative and summative, simulated standardized patient encounters, and clinical site evaluations provided by faculty and preceptors. Collectively, these measures allow faculty to determine if each student has attained program outcomes upon graduation along with the level of quality education. Annual alumni surveys evaluate program outcomes along

with employment and national certification rates.

Process for Interpretation of Evidence:

Program aggregate and individual data are collected every semester and reviewed by the Dean, the Associate Dean, the NP Program Director, DNP/NP/PMHNP Program Coordinators, and the faculty member(s) responsible for teaching the course(s). Significant issues or trends related to the course content/structure is addressed by the NP Program Director, DNP/NP/PMHNP Program Coordinators. If an action plan is required, the faculty and NP Program Director, DNP/NP/PMHNP Program Coordinators will collaborate on the revisions with the faculty member. The NP Team receives certification pass/fail rates annually from the appropriate certification boards. The benchmark established for evaluation of graduate pass rates is to meet or exceed the national average for that cohort of test takers.
