Together they edit syllabi based upon student feedback. This past year several faculty members identified writing as an area for improvement for the ENL student. Since September 2019, all students entering the ENL program have participated in a program entitled "The WRITE Program". This online program assesses graduate student writing level and provides feedback to students regarding their level of competency regarding writing thus ensuring success in a very writing-centric graduate program. In Fall 2021, an ENL Program Coordinator was hired to lead and expand the program. This includes meeting with each faculty and

reviewing courses, faculty evaluations, and exit student interviews.
