


ScreenCast-O-Matic Set Up

ScreenCast-O-Matic software can be used for webcam and screen capture of lecture materials, like narrated PowerPoint presentations. You can also use it for giving students feedback on written assignments. Training and Support is available through Media Services within the ITS department. ims@san Diego.edu.

Install

1. Type <https://screencast-o-matic.com/uofsandiego> in a web browser.

After Downloading

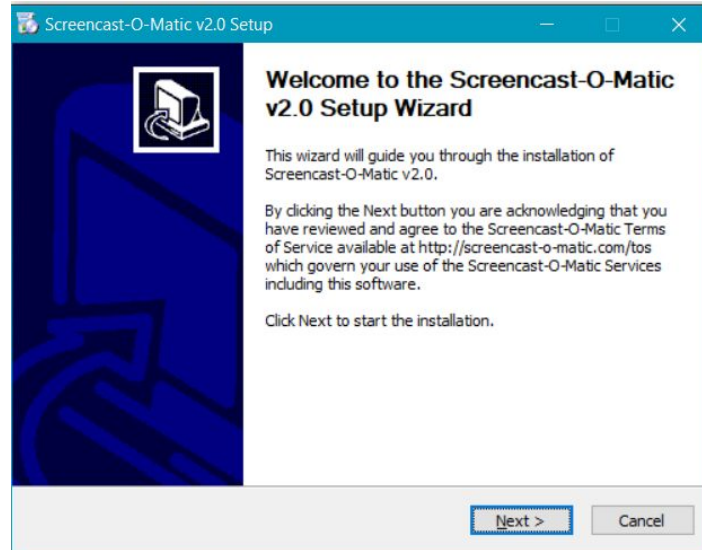
Follow these steps to enable upgrade:

1. Run the installer
2. Click the "I have a **Team Plan**" button
3. Enter this Access Url: **uofsandiego**

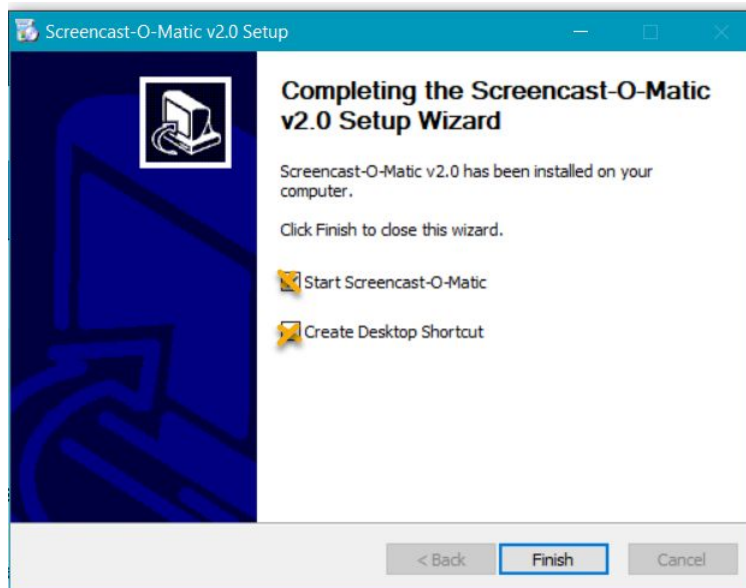

1. Locate the downloaded file, and double-click to execute/launch the installer program (lower right corner in Chrome/Windows). Click **Next** to install.

1. If you are using your own computer, install Screencast-O-Matic “Just for Me” In a few seconds, you should see this prompt.



- Select Start Screencasto-matic
- Select Create Desktop Shortcut.

1. Click **Finish**. You will see the Screencast-O-Matic interface. In future uses, launch Screencast-O-Matic from your desktop tray (Windows) by double-clicking on the Screencast-O-Matic icon .
