Measures

Student learning is assessed using direct measures, such as: case studies, presentations, course/program examinations, research papers, portfolios, practicum/fieldwork evaluations, certifications/licensure examinations or capstone assignments/projects. Student learning is also assessed using indirect measures from survey data: Exit Surveys, Alumni Surveys, Community Partner Surveys, or Employer Surveys. Collectively these measures allow us to determine the level and quality of education received by our students.
