Does project-based learning (PBL) raise student achievement? If you've been involved in PBL for long, you've undoubtedly encountered this question. Over the last few years at the University of Michigan and Michigan State University, research educators Duke and Halvorsen have worked to address this question through a large study of the effects of PBL on social studies and some aspects of literacy achievement in second-grade classrooms. They call this initiative Project PLACE: A Project Approach to Literacy and Civic Engagement.

What is SL's Impact on Students?

Research studies of service-learning demonstrate that service-learning programs can have positive impacts on youth in three general areas: academic engagement and achievement; civic attitudes and behaviors; and social and personal skills. The studies also demonstrate that students gain the maximum benefit when their service-learning experience includes a direct tie to the curriculum, planning and design of service projects by students, structured reflection on the service experience in the classroom, and continuity of service for at least one semester.

The Service Learning – Empathy Connection,

Empathy is defined as a means to recognize and appreciate the feelings of others, the origins of these feelings, and the ability to engage in the emotional episodes of an individual while remaining apart from them (Keen, 2007). Service learning has been found to develop a student's overall empathetic agency (Wilson, 2011). Through their service learning placements, students learn more about the sensibilities of others. Through reflection and discussion, they develop an appreciation for the thoughts, feelings, and ideas expressed by others and can begin to put themselves in the position(s) of other people.
