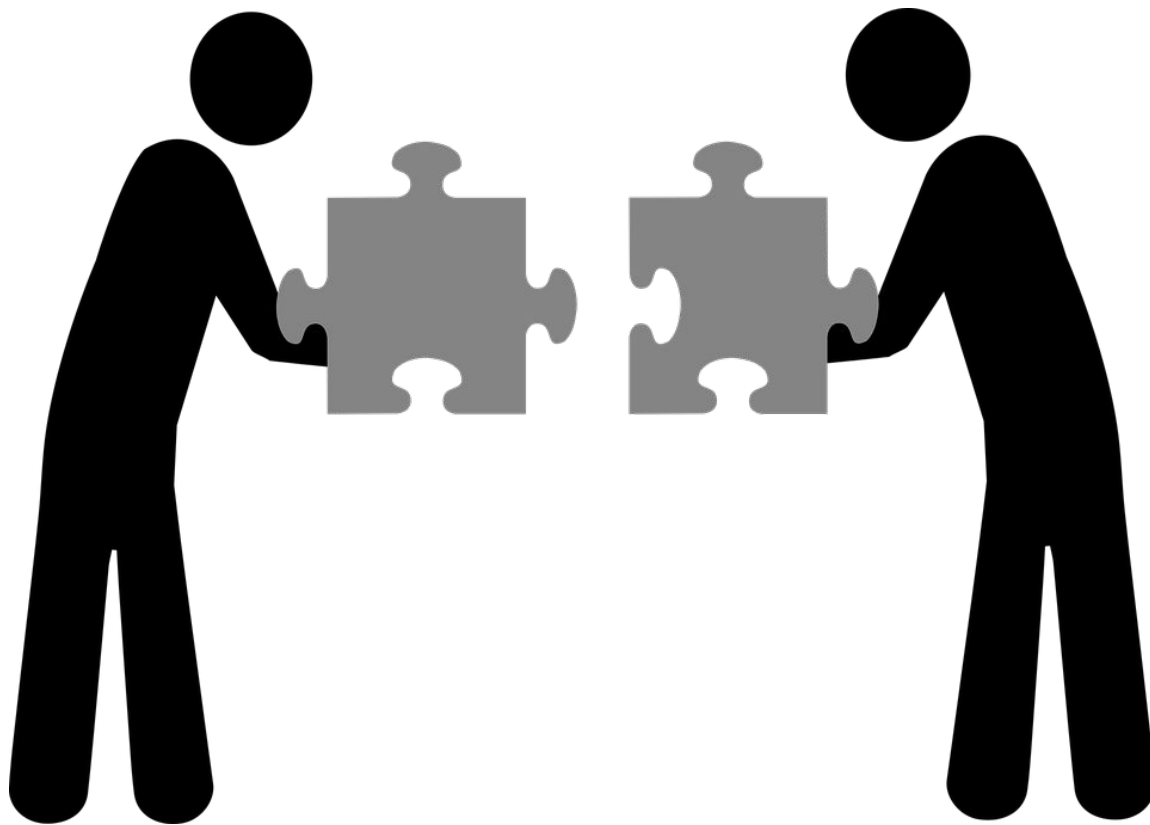





# Inter-organization Collaboration



# Why Collaborate?

- Looking outside of the specific organization gives members the ability to see the greater USD community in a new light
- More resources, people, etc = bigger and better programs
- Members of the USD community always benefit from gaining exposure to others who bring different experiences and perspectives.
- Collaborating with other organizations provides an opportunity to market your event to many more/different kinds of people

# How: Mission Alignment

-  Tip #1 for finding organizations you might want to partner with: mission alignment.
-  Look at your organization's own mission, then at the mission of another organization.
-  What buzz-words overlap? What areas might your organization benefit from focusing on? Another organization might be strong in that particular area.

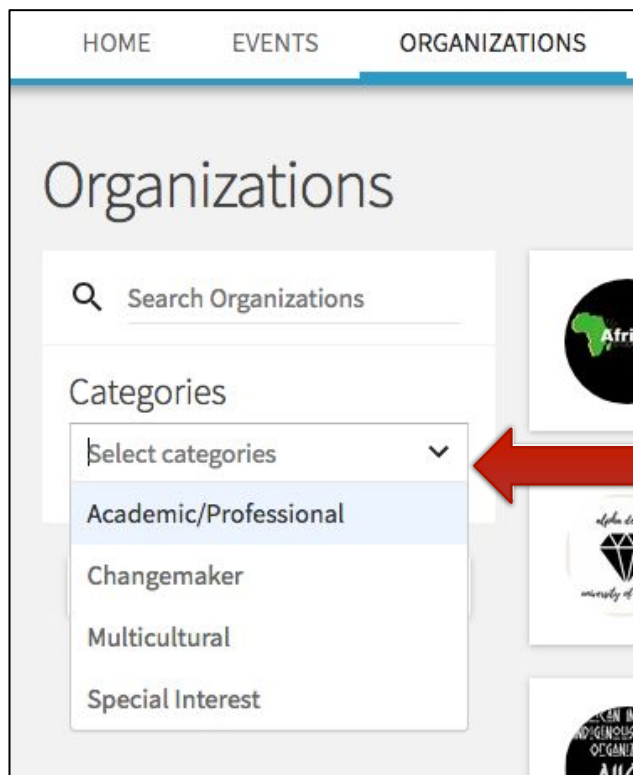
# Example: USD Mission Statement

***“The University of San Diego is a Roman Catholic institution committed to advancing academic excellence, expanding liberal and professional knowledge, creating a diverse and inclusive community, and preparing leaders dedicated to ethical conduct and compassionate service.”***

- ↗ Above is the USD mission statement. Every organization on campus has some component of the USD mission in their own mission, whether it be academic or professional excellence, inclusion and diversity, compassionate service, or leadership...so it's great to look at the overlap between organization missions!

↗ ToreroOrgs is really useful in exploring different types of organizations. There's a full list of organizations as well as the contact information for each.



On the left hand side of ToreroOrgs, you can sort organizations by category. The different categories of organizations include:

# ToreroOrgs Profiles

➤ If you go to the "profile" of any organization, you can see their primary contact's information

➤ Information included on the organization profile pages includes:

- Advisor Information
- Org President Information
- Meeting Time Information
- Any additional website or contact information
